Nursery Hill Newsletter


Dear Parents/Carers,

Today is the end of the second week of Autumn term 2. We must continue to wash our hands regularly, wear our masks and keep a safe distance from others, this is to save lives and save the NHS. We must all work together to keep ourselves and others safe.

Schools are still open and it is mandatory that children attend. At Nursery Hill we will still be following our Risk Assessment, which we are continually reviewing and updating. Can I ask you to support us by adhering to our school guidelines.

You will have noticed that staff have been wearing their masks when they come outside to collect and deliver the children to the playground. This is in case they urgently need to talk to parents at the beginning and end of the day.

We have some excellent news for parents and carers in school and in the community. The Governuing Body met on the last day of Autumn

Term 1(Friday 23^{rd} October) and made the decision that as a school we will be offering full time Nursery provision.

The Nursery children will be part of our Early Years with a curriculum personalised to meet their learning needs. This will make a great difference to school and to the early learning lives of the children.

Tax Free Childcare?

Have you heard of Tax Free Childcare?

It is a government scheme to help with the cost of childcare at a variety of settings. You can get up to £500 every 3 months (up to £2,000 a year) for each of your children to help with the cost of childcare. This goes up to £1,000 every 3 months if a child is disabled (up to £4,000 a year). If you are eligible for Tax-Free Childcare, you can set up an online childcare account for your child.
